Subject: **Executive Order 2020-21 (COVID-19)
Temporary Requirement to Suspend Activities that are not Necessary to Sustain
or Protect Life**

Per Executive Order 2020-21 (COVID-19) - Temporary Requirements to Suspend Activities that are not Necessary to Sustain or Protect Life signed by Governor Gretchen Whitmer on March 23, 2020, the following actions will be implemented by the City of Flushing:

Flushing City Hall and associated buildings, 725 East Main Street, Flushing, MI 48433 will be closed to the public effective TUESDAY, MARCH 24, 2020 through MONDAY APRIL 13, 2020. Only critical infrastructure workers will be reporting to work during this time.

Critical infrastructure workers are those workers described by the Director of the US Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency in his guidance of March 19, 2020 on the COVID 19 response. Such workers include some workers in each of the following sectors:

- Law enforcement, public safety and first responders
- Water and wastewater
- Public works
